THE DIVINE OFFICE UNITES US TO THE PASSION OF CHRIST

All priests are bound to the daily recitation of the breviary, which is composed of seven 'canonical hours' every day that can be recited either privately or in community.

Each one of them is a kind of renewal of Christ's words: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there in the midst of them." (Mt 18;20).

The Offices of **Matins** and **Lauds** represent the moment when Our Lord was arrested in the garden, bound by soldiers and led

away like

a criminal. At **Prime** we call to mind His suffering before Caiaphas, how He was struck, mocked, and judged worthy of death. **Terce** is the hour of His condemnation by Pilate, **Sext** the hour of His crucifixion. At **None** we remember His death and the lance that pierced His side. At **Vespers** we recall when He was taken down from the cross, and at **Compline** when He was laid in the tomb.

"The early Christians, on the eve of the *Sacrum Triduum* used to recite the *Nocturns*, or *Tenebræ*. In some places this office was assigned to the eighth hour of the night, in other to midnight. The Church now permits that these functions take place on the eve of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, although said in the afternoon they finish in the dark, being considered an office of mourning representing the funeral of the Redeemer.

Beside the six candles on the altar, fifteen other of a yellow color are lit on a triangular candlestick and are extinguished at the end of each psalm. This ceremony alludes to the conduct of the Apostles and disciples who failed in their promise and nearly abandoned their Master by seeking their own safety in flight.

The candle that remains lit, and which is ultimately hidden behind the altar is symbolic, either of the Blessed Virgin who preserved her faith unshaken in the resurrection of Christ, or of Christ Himself who, after having been deprived of life by ungrateful and preserve men rose from the sepulchre."
