A Happy New Year 2015!


Dear Friends of the Institute,

Despite its difficult atmosphere, climate, and ever-present malaria, the satisfaction given to them by the openness of the African population, through conversions and hundreds of baptisms every year, equals the strain on their health and all the hardships that they must endure.

"Why do we send missionaries? Why is the Church a Church that needs to be always missionary? Why do we take care of these countries?

To answer that question, we have to look at the first, the very first missionary: Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself. He is sent by the Father into a world of sin and darkness to give His life and redeem all mankind! Therefore the Church continues to send missionaries to African countries to redeem the people from the snares of the devil.
